III. Certificate Goals

Students who complete the requirements for the Maddie's Professional Certificate in Shelter Medicine will be able to:

1. Understand the critical role played by veterinarians in protecting the health and welfare of sheltered dogs and cats.
2. Recognize and respond to compromised behavioral health of sheltered animals.
3. Recognize and respond to compromised physical health of sheltered animals.
4. Develop skills in high-quality, high-volume surgical sterilization techniques.
5. Use the Association of Shelter Veterinarians 2010 *Guidelines for Standards of Care in Animal Shelters* as a guide to best practices for Shelter Medicine.

V. Assessments

Admission and retention in the certificate program requires good academic standing as defined by the College of Veterinary Medicine Academic Advancement Committee. Courses employ a variety of assessments to evaluate academic progress, such as: quizzes; exams; subjective evaluations of medical and surgical proficiency

in a clinical setting; attendance at lectures, discussions, and/or laboratories; papers; projects; participation in teaching rounds; and review of assigned readings.
